Match report

Whiskey striker Ludovic Mahu wrapped up a 4-0 victory at Lower Hutt park to set a record for goals scored by a foreigner in his second season in the NZ Master 2 League.

Ludovic' goal was his 27th since arriving from Christchurch nomads, taking him past Ruud van Nistelrooy's total when he arrived at Manchester United.

Stop out Rebel did well to keep The North Wellington Whiskey quiet for an hour, but once Ludo had scored a fine goal, there was no way back for 'Stop out Rebel' side.

Stop out rebel, who have a more than decent recent record against North Wellington, left out Yossi Benayoun and restored to Sami Hyypia defence.

After the excitement and pure theatre of the Poker Night, the whiskey needed to get back to basics to maintain their grip on the second spot.

But not surprisingly, Hutt Park on a grey, wet Saturday lunchtime did not quite possess the atmosphere of a red-hot Poker night.

“Four season in ones day”

The first chance came after two minutes when Terry, playing his 300th league game for the club, shot from 30 meters a powerful kick on target. The keeper who manage to get the ball out of the goal

The tempo was on? Terry was every where running passing and dribbling in vein falling again "another brick in the wall"

The second chance came after nine minutes when Terry, saw a whipped in cross flicked narrowly wide by Westies.

"We don,t need another heroes"

A fine challenge by defender then stopped Westies in full flow.

Soon after Ludo managed to upset referee Alan Wiley when he went down far too easily as Rebel goalkeeper came out to meet him on the left of the box.

The Hutt official was rightly quick to warn the Whiskey striker, who escaped a yellow card.

Referee ignored far more obvious claims for a free-kick when Paul bundled the opposition striker over on the edge of the box.

When Ludo and Terry combined to set-up Westies for a 20-yard shot that looked to be deflected wide the official gave a goal-kick, much to the growing anger of the home crowd.

Chris then saw a 25-yard shot held by the keeper.

The French forward volley just wide from a Terry corner-kick.

Jo and Bill received a tremendous reception from the Kop at the start of the second-half,

☹️After 59 minutes, Phil introduced Russell to replace our international injured Terry and his energy was instrumental in the early build-up assisted by Bruce to a fine Ludo goal on the hour.

☹️Russell won possession and fed Ludo, the frenchman exchanging passes with other team member before the Whiskey striker cut into the box and side-footed the ball past the goal keeper to Russell for the second goal.

Ludo appealed for a penalty in the 71st minute after a tackle by behind, replays suggesting he was more sinner than sinned against.

☹️But the whiskey went further ahead after 76 minutes when Ludo passing three other player to provide Chris (Doc) with the third Goal.

☹️Frazer won possession. When his cross curled into the box, Ludo was there to control and past both defender and keeper to score again.

Bruce told the Hutt news: 'It's a really proud day to clock up that many games. It's a great day, a good performance, .

'Rebel were very good defensively, we had to be patient but eventually the opening came.'

Ludo paid tribute to the Zooloo impact since his move from the bush last summer.

'He's a good player, he makes good runs and he's a pleasure to play with,' Ludo added.

'To get 1 goals in his first season at front is unbelievable and I'm sure he's got a few left.'

Victory took the Whiskey to two points from the leader city rivals West in the race for the final Master 2 League spot after West could only draw with Brooklyn yesterday.

'It's going to be a good chase but we're confident we can achieve first place.'
